1) Solve the following equation for $x: \frac{1}{4}(6x-7) + \frac{1}{7}(3x-5) = \frac{1}{28}(5x+78)$

$$-\frac{1}{3}r = \frac{1}{4}s$$


$$4(T - \frac{1}{3}r) = 4 \cdot \frac{1}{4}s$$

$$4T - \frac{1}{3}r = s \longrightarrow S = 4T - 2r$$


3) The sum of two consecutive even integers is 34. What are the two numbers?

7) Find the slope, y-intercept, and x-intercept of the following line: 2x - 6y = -6


$$2x-6y=-6$$




8) Use the point slope formula to find the equation of the line passing through (3,0) and (-3,2). Write the line in the form y = mx + b. Graph the line on the plot below.

$$96 = l$$


