Paul R. Halmos, the author of the textbook *Naive Set Theory*, died in 2006. Paul J. Cohen, who made major contributions related to the Continuum Hypothesis and other questions of a similar nature, died in 2007. John W. Backus, whose work on computer language grammars is mentioned in the course notes and who also invented the standard programming language FORTRAN, died in 2007.
