This course moves VERY FAST in the summer, so please try to avoid falling behind schedule. That being said, you may continue working after the due date, but a <u>late penalty of 20% per day</u> will be applied to all questions completed after the posted due date.

Homework will account for 20% of your course grade.

Ouizzes

The TA will give a quiz during the second half of every discussion following a group activity. To promote critical thinking, the group activities and quizzes in discussion are intended to be *more challenging* than what you will see on the midterm and final exams. You are allowed to use any materials you have written for yourself during the the quiz. If you have written your notes in an electronic tablet (e.g. iPad, Surface Pro, etc.), then you may use your device but you are required to also set it to airplane mode for the duration of the quiz. Once you are done, use or phone or some other device to upload your solution on Gradescope before you leave your discussion.

I will also give a one-question mini-quiz towards the end of each lecture to assess what you have learned for the day. Each mini-quiz should take about five (5) minutes to complete. You are allowed to use your lecture notes for the mini-quizzes. Once you are done, use your phone or some other device to upload your solution on Gradescope before you leave our classroom.

The scores for all the quizzes (discussion quizzes and my mini-quizzes) will count for 20% of your course grade.

Midterm and Final Exams

I will allow everyone to use one two-sided 8x11 cheat sheet for each exam, on which you can write down anything you would like. Your cheat sheet must be handwritten by yourself, NOT typed or photocopied. During the exam, I will walk around the classrom to inspect everyone's cheat sheets; if yours does not conform to my requirements (because it was typed, photocopied, or the paper size is too large), then you will need to complete the exam without your cheat sheet.

The midterm exam accounts for 20% of your course grade, and the final exam will account for 40% of your course grade.

Missed Exam, Quiz, or Homework

Absence from an exam, quiz, or HW will be excused only if you can provide verifiable and convincing evidence that you have a significant illness or serious family crises, which will prevent you from attending. Except under extremely unusual circumstances, you must inform the TA or me in advance of the missed test. If you missed the midterm, you will be expected to promptly make arrangements with your TA to take a make-up test. If you miss a quiz for an excusable reason, you will be excused from the quiz. That is, your grade will be computed as though the quiz were not on the syllabus.
