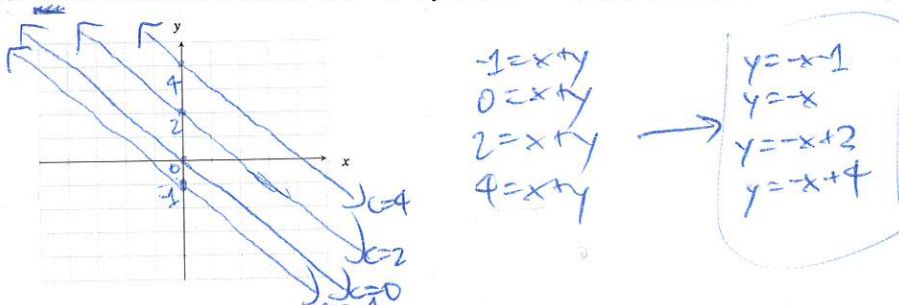
(3 pts) 1. Evaluate $\int x e^{4x} dx$.

$$\begin{aligned} u &= x & dv &= e^{4x} dx \\ du &= dx & v &= \frac{1}{4} e^{4x} \\ \int x e^{4x} dx &= (x) \left(\frac{1}{4} e^{4x} \right) - \int \left(\frac{1}{4} e^{4x} \right) (dx) \\ &= \frac{1}{4} x e^{4x} - \frac{1}{4} \int e^{4x} dx \\ &= \frac{1}{4} x e^{4x} - \frac{1}{4} \left(\frac{1}{4} e^{4x} + C \right) \\ &= \boxed{\frac{1}{4} x e^{4x} - \frac{1}{16} e^{4x} + C} \end{aligned}$$

(3 pts) 2. Evaluate $\int_{-\infty}^0 e^{-x} dx$.

$$\begin{aligned} \int_{-\infty}^0 e^{-x} dx &= \lim_{a \rightarrow -\infty} \int_a^0 e^{-x} dx \\ &= \lim_{a \rightarrow -\infty} (-e^{-x}) \Big|_a^0 \\ &= \lim_{a \rightarrow -\infty} (-e^{-0} - (-e^{-a})) \\ &= \lim_{a \rightarrow -\infty} (-1 + e^{-a}) \\ &= -1 + e^{-(-\infty)} = -1 + e^{+\infty} = -1 + \infty = \boxed{\infty} \end{aligned}$$

(3 pts) 3. Describe the level curves of $z = x + y$ with $c = -1, 0, 2, 4$. Sketch a contour map of the surface using level curves for these c -values.



(3 pts) 4. Find the first partial derivatives of $f(x, y) = \ln(3x + 5y)$ and evaluate the partial derivatives at $(1, 0)$.

$$\begin{aligned} f_x(x, y) &= \frac{\partial}{\partial x} \ln(3x + 5y) \\ &= \frac{1}{3x + 5y} \cdot \frac{\partial}{\partial x} (3x + 5y) \\ &= \frac{3}{3x + 5y} \\ f_x(1, 0) &= \frac{3}{3(1) + 5(0)} = \boxed{1} \end{aligned} \qquad \begin{aligned} f_y(x, y) &= \frac{\partial}{\partial y} \ln(3x + 5y) \\ &= \frac{1}{3x + 5y} \cdot \frac{\partial}{\partial y} (3x + 5y) \\ &= \frac{5}{3x + 5y} \\ f_y(1, 0) &= \frac{5}{3(1) + 5(0)} = \boxed{\frac{5}{3}} \end{aligned}$$

(3 pts) 5. Find the first partial derivatives of $f(x, y) = 200x^{0.7}y^{0.3}$ and evaluate the partial derivatives at $(1000, 500)$.

$$\begin{aligned} f_x(x, y) &= \frac{\partial}{\partial x} (200x^{0.7}y^{0.3}) \\ &= 200 \frac{\partial}{\partial x} (x^{0.7}) y^{0.3} \\ &= 200(0.7x^{-0.3}) y^{0.3} \\ &= (200)(0.7)x^{-0.3}y^{0.3} \\ f_x(1000, 500) &= (200)(0.7)(1000)^{-0.3}(500)^{0.3} \end{aligned} \qquad \begin{aligned} f_y(x, y) &= \frac{\partial}{\partial y} (200x^{0.7}y^{0.3}) \\ &= 200x^{0.7} \frac{\partial}{\partial y} (y^{0.3}) \\ &= 200x^{0.7}(0.3y^{-0.7}) \\ &= (200)(0.3)x^{0.7}y^{-0.7} \\ f_y(1000, 500) &= (200)(0.3)(1000)^{0.7}(500)^{-0.7} \end{aligned}$$
